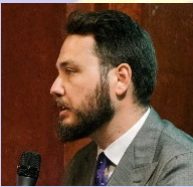

**Gaetana Morgante:** Gaetana Morgante is the Director of DIRPOLIS, Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna. As a professor at the Scuola, she carries out research activities in Criminal Law focusing on public and private corruption, criminal labour law, principles of criminal responsibility in risky activities, models of corporate liability, legal tools for fighting illegal markets. She has been also engaged in the analysis of organised crime and terrorism, protection of vulnerable persons and gender-based victimisation



**Andrea Bertolini:** Andrea Bertolini is the Director of the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Regulation of Robotics and AI "EURA". He is Assistant Professor of Private Law at the DIRPOLIS Institute, Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna, and Adjunct Professor in Private Law at the University of Pisa. His research ranges from private law (contracts, torts, law of obligations) to the regulation of robotics and AI and bioethics, with a comparative and law and economics approach.



**Maria Chiara Carrozza:** Maria Chiara Carrozza is the President of the CNR (National Research Center). She is full professor of Industrial Bioengineering at Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna, and coordinates various research projects in the fields of biorobotics and neuro-robotics. She was Minister of Education, University and Research from 2013 to 2014, and Rector of Scuola Superiore Sant'Anna in 2007.



**Brando Benifei:** Brando Benifei is a Member of the European Parliament. His main area of work are International Market and Consumers Protection, Employment and Social Affairs, and Constitutional Affairs. He is active on youth policies, digitalisation and rights of people with disabilities.



**David Reichel:** Dr. David Reichel works in the Justice, Digital and Migration Unit of the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA). He is responsible for managing FRA's research projects in the areas covering artificial intelligence and online content moderation. Prior to joining FRA in 2014, he worked in the research department of the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD) and as a lecturer at the Institute for Sociology and the Institute for International Development at the University of Vienna. He teaches courses on measuring human rights, and has published numerous articles, working papers and book chapters on issues related to migration and integration statistics, citizenship and human rights.
